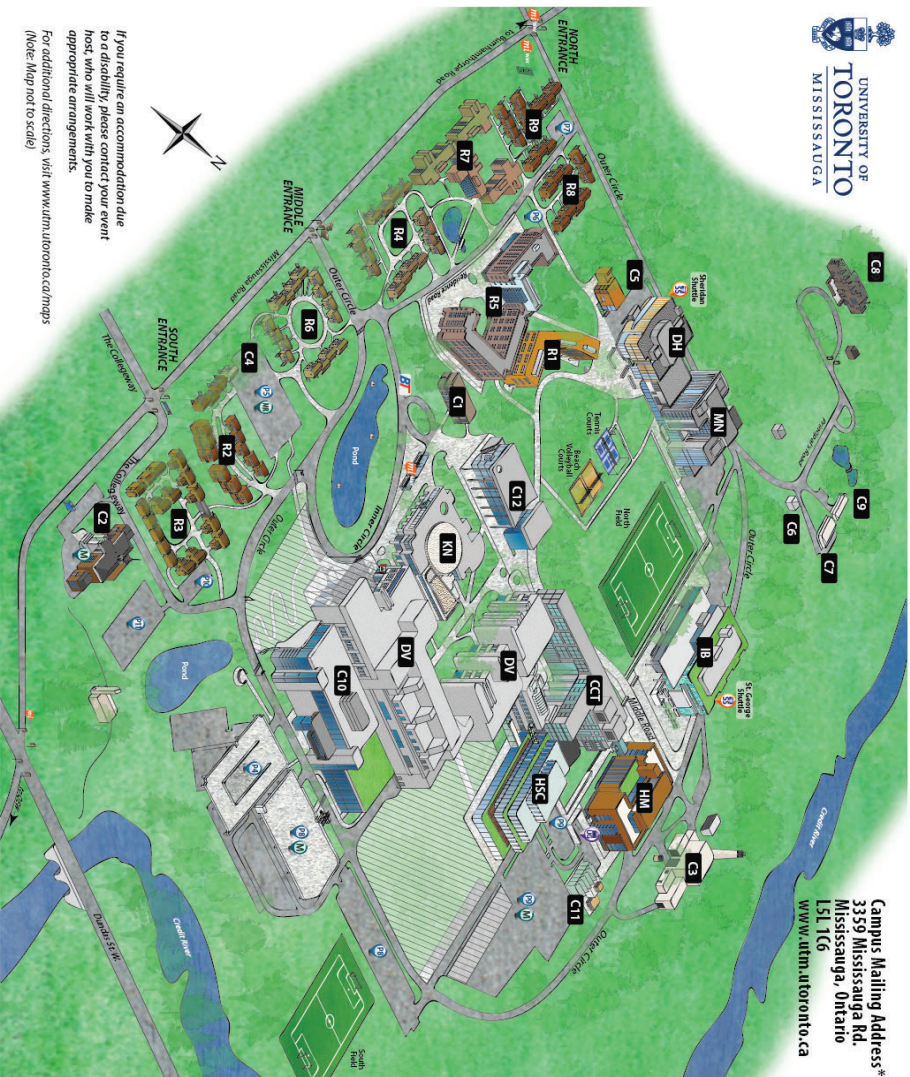

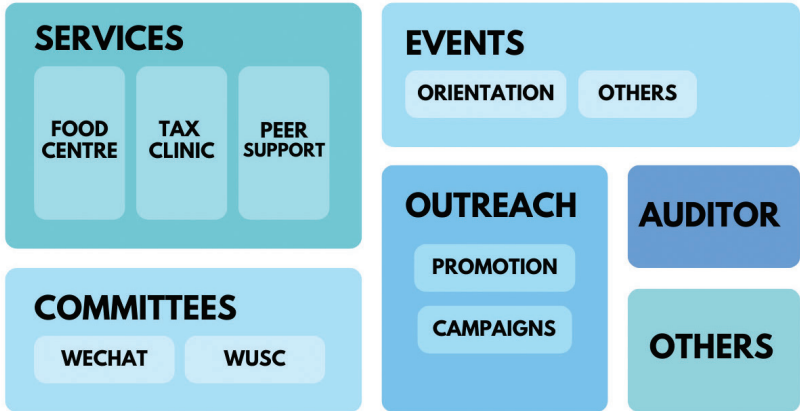

UTMSU provides affordable and comprehensive health and dental coverage to all full-time undergraduate and Mississauga Academy of Medicine (MAM) students at the University of Toronto Mississauga campus. The health and dental plans are provided through Green Shield Canada, the only national not-for-profit insurance provider in Canada with the support of the National Student Health Network.

Depending on your registration, the plans provide extended health and dental coverage for up to 12 months, from September 1 to August 31 annually. Health & Dental

Your UTMSU health and dental plans help ensure that you can take care of your health and well-being during your post-secondary studies by offering a wide range of benefits. Here is a look at some of what your plan covers.

health benefits (up to \$5,000)

- Prescription drugs: 90% coverage up to \$5,000.
- Vaccines: 90% coverage up to \$200.
- Oral & Devices Contraceptives: 100% coverage up to \$250.
- Physiotherapy: \$30 per visit for up to 20 visits.
- *NEW* Psychologist, Counsellor, Social Worker, Psychotherapist: \$125 per visit up to 25 visits.

dental benefits (up to \$800)

- Basic Services: minimum coverage of 70%.
- Basic Restorative Services/Basic Oral Surgery: minimum coverage of 60%
- Periodontal Services: minimum coverage of 70%.

vision care (up to \$200 every 24 months)

Reimbursement for vision care by a licensed Optometrist, Optician or Ophthalmologist. The amount can be used towards eye examinations or the purchase of prescription glasses/contacts.

travel coverage (up to \$5,000,000)

Expenses arising as a result of a medical emergency while you or an eligible dependent are temporarily outside of your regular province of residence for vacation, business, or education will be considered eligible under the Travel benefit.

Tax Clinic

Through our membership with the Canadian Federation of Students, students have access to FREE tax filing through UFile! Members are able to use the UFile online platform to learn more about the tax filing process and how to successfully submit for the 2024-2025 tax year.

In addition, the UTMSU hosts an on-campus tax clinic in co-operation with the CRA CVITP program. Our Tax Clinic opens in March and April and is a service that assists students file their taxes for free. We will only be filing for the most recent tax year. This service benefits students earning \$40,000 or less annually.

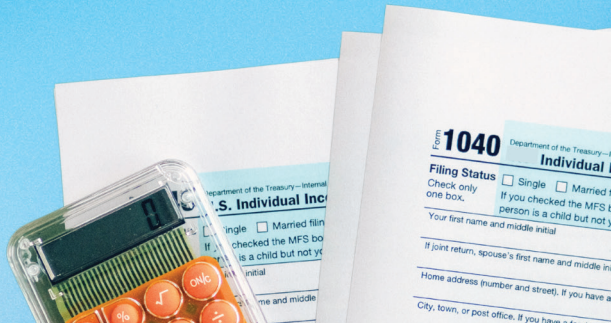

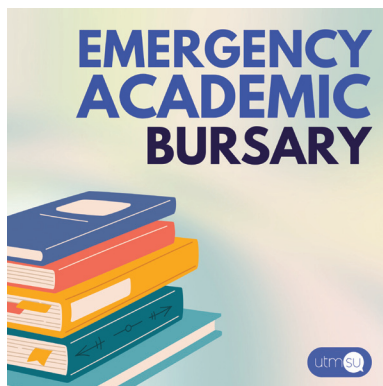


Bursaries

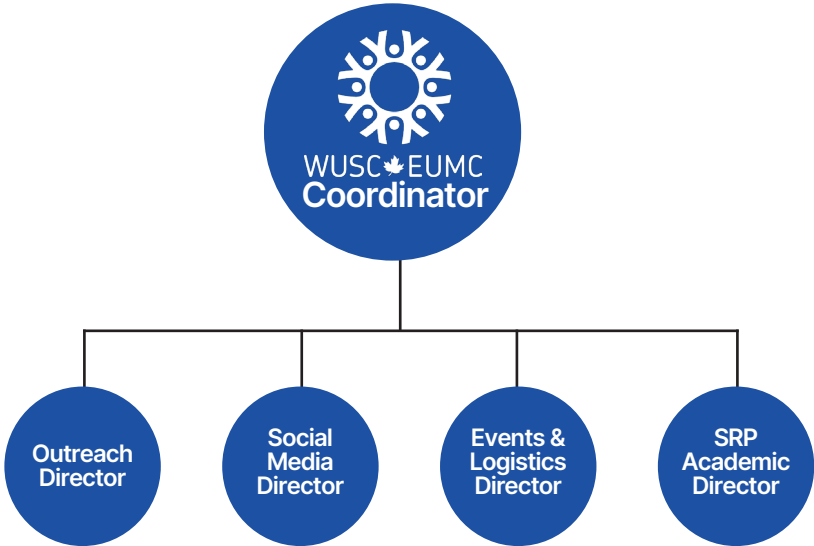

Below are a few examples of what would be considered an academic offence at UofT.

a few examples of academic offences

- Having your cell phone on and in your pocket during your exams
- Using ChatGPT or other external organizations or individuals to write essays and complete assignments
- Signing participation on behalf of your friend or vice-versa
- Re-submitting an assignment previously used in one of your courses
- Altering a medical document
- Falsifying references in your work

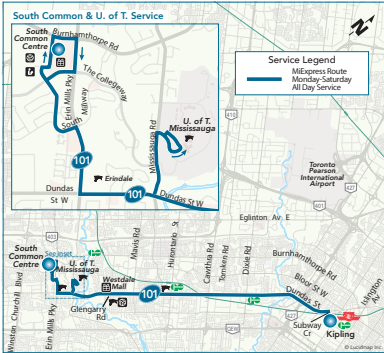

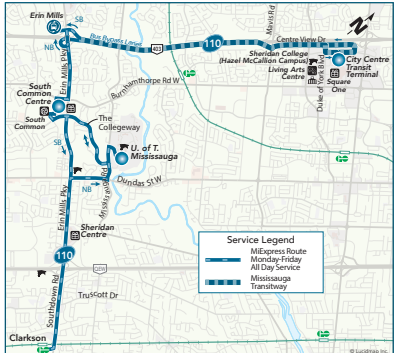

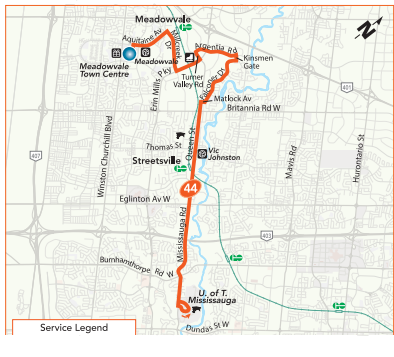
